APRIL AT THE MUSEUM

What's happening behind the scenes at the Museum? A lot!

Our latest exhibit **"Roy Brown and His Fabulous Flying Machine"** is on display in the Foss Room for the month of April. We're busy getting ready for the next exhibit—all about local honey producers! We'll share the title of this exhibit soon (honestly, still deciding!..) but we have been collecting local honey tins and equipment in preparation. It's a fascinating subject to research! If you have any honey related items you might like to loan to the museum for the summer, do get in touch!



April is the month we post our available summer student positions, interview candidates and offer summer employment to two talented young people. Did you know we rely on government grants to pay our students? This year's YCW program is covering 53% of our cost to hire one student for 12 weeks, rather than the previous 75%. We do maintain a reserve for our usual 25% (about \$2,000) contribution, but this 47% is an unexpected cost.

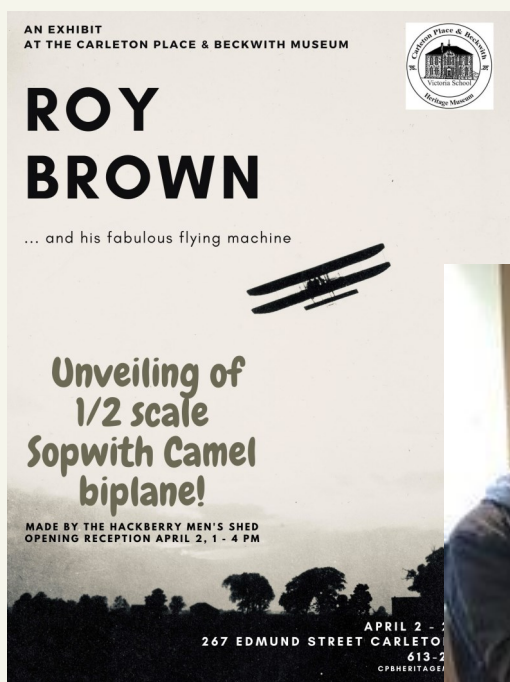
