The White family has very generously offered to host a fundraising concert at their century farm!

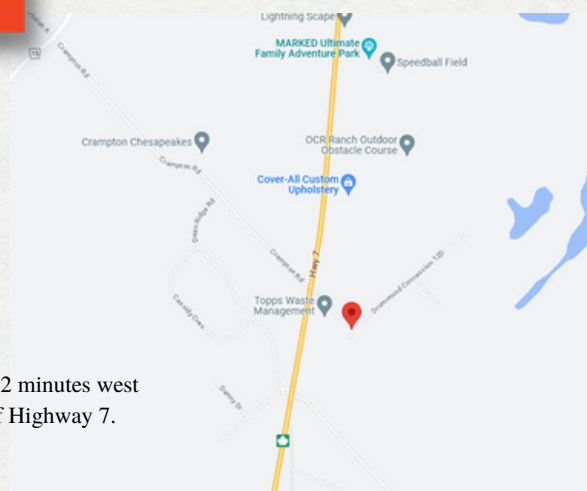

107-109 BRIDGE STREET, CARLETON PLACE



This false front frame building with living quarters in the rear was constructed about 1874 by William Brundige. His early tenants included Steele's Tin Shop, Wilson's Bakery and Northern Telegraph before son in law George Keyes opened his shoe store here in 1893. The building was destroyed by fire in 1897.



The newly built Keyes Block was constructed in 1898 with two separate store fronts.



The Union Bank of Canada rented 109 Bridge Street from 1898 to 1913, followed by Baird and Riddell Men's Wear.



One of many subsequent tenants, the Granary Natural Foods opened at 107 Bridge Street in 1977. They expanded their space in 2015, encompassing the entire first floor.



Cal Moore married George Keyes' daughter Edena, and opened Moore's Central Grocery at 107 Bridge in 1919. Maynard Argue took over in 1942 and Argue's Food Market operated until 1964.



This metal sign was recently donated to the Museum by Dena Comley, owner of The Granary.
