Robbie Probert "The Candlestick Maker" opened his Riverside Store at 137 Bridge Street in 1974. The store carried a wide range of "Refreshingly Canadian" merchandise - most made by Robbie and his father Harry. Items included hand rolled beeswax candles and cedar candlesticks made from old fence posts found in Lanark County.

Some of his most loved products were the line of "Canadian Settler" soaps, and the burlap wall plaques featuring Canadian animals carved from Lanark cedar.
