




When you visit the CP&B Museum at 267 Edmund Street, take a minute to look waay up on the front façade, just under the roofline. There you'll see a carved stone: "*Town Hall 1872*".

Proudly installed by contractor William Willoughby as the building neared completion, this datestone marks the 150 years that this solid stone building has stood on this spot. The building has served the community in many ways in those 150 years; town hall, lock-up, meeting hall, ammunitions storage, auditorium, public school, offices, conservation authority headquarters, military museum, and now as a community museum.

Changes to its appearance have taken place. Windows have been altered, entrances and stairs built and rebuilt in various places, a belfry installed and then removed, iron fire escapes added and outbuildings to the east constructed and removed. What were originally rough fields surrounding the building soon became playgrounds and grassy baseball diamonds, and later still, parking lots, before a lush community garden and a labyrinth arrived.

Facing to the west, to the glorious sunsets over the Mississippi River, the building has seen much in its lifetime. It's current use as a community museum suits it well; the building is now telling its own history and the history of the community it has watched grow and develop.
