ings of Carleton Place project. I hope to see you at the Museum - or at one of our events this summer!



# President's CORNER

Preserving local history is an ongoing process and one that predates the Historical Society. Everyone has a personal history which is interconnected with that of the community. Our opportunities and experiences follow a path and are influenced by the signposts erected by those that have gone before. Sometimes those signposts are obvious and sometimes they are so familiar that we do not even notice them. The preservation of these signposts artifacts, photos, memories, etc. strengthens a community's identity. The Historical Society and the Museum are two of the main repositories of local history. Over the next four years there will be many opportunities to share those signposts. Canada150 in 2017 is the celebration of Canada's 150th Anniversary. In 1918 we mark the 100th Anniversary of the end of the First World War and the encounter of Roy Brown with the Red Baron. 

### CMOG: Going, Going, Going...

The letters CMOG have been on the lips, minds, and keyboards of our Museum Manager Jennifer and volunteer Wendy for well over a year. The four letters stand for the Ministry of Tourism, Culture and Sport's Community Museum Operating Grant. Following a very stringent and complex application process, the grant strengthens their role in their communities as custodians and interpreters of the province's irreplaceable heritage collections. New policies and procedures have been updated, re-written and created to meet the rigourous standards now required of museums seeking support from the Ministry. It has been a valuable and worthwhile - and time-consuming - endeavour as we work to make our wonderful little Museum an even better experience for visitors and information-seekers alike. However, the Ministry made a sudden announcement last month (just as we were within hours of completing the application process) that in 2016-17, due to fiscal restraints, only museums funded in 2015-16 will be eligible to apply for funding. Of course, that eliminates the Museum. On the bright side, we can proudly state that we now meet the Ministry's tough standards. On the other side, it means at least another year of scrambling to maintain these standards on a shoestring budget.
