"Word of the armistice reached Carleton Place at 4 a.m. and was spread at once by a united din of church and fire alarm bells and factory bells and whistles.

A great bonfire was built before dawn in the market square on Franklin street. Impromptu and organized parades and noisy celebrations of relief continued from then until midnight."

It was held outdoors, with indoor meetings banned while war-spread Spanish influenza was taking its toll of 30,000 Canadian lives.
