In August, the new owners of the cottage contacted the museum enquiring about its history. We were able to connect them with Winnie's neice who arranged to come for a visit to the Lake. Our curator Jennifer was invited to spend a wonderful afternoon touring this century cottage, and listening to old family stories. We looked through old photos, exclaimed at treasures found in the building, and enjoyed watching the sailboats rounding the point into Duff Bay.
